Last Friday, February 23<sup>rd</sup>, there were 511 dinners sold. It was a big success!




#### **Phone & Fire Alarm System:**

#### **Five First Saturdays Devotion:**



On December 10, 1925, Our Lady Fatima, appeared to Lucy, one of the 3 Shepherd children that saw Our Lady at Fatima. She spoke to Lucy and said: "My child, behold My Heart surrounded with the thorns which ungrateful men place

therein at every moment by their

blasphemies and ingratitude. You, at least, try to console Me. Announce in My name that I promise to assist at the hour of death, all those who, on the



first Saturday of five consecutive months, shall:

- 1. Go to confession and receive Holy Communion,
- 2. Recite the Rosary,
- 3. Keep Me company for a 15 minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary,
- 4. With the intention of making reparation to Me. I promise to assist them at the hour of their death with all the graces necessary to save their souls."

If you would like to partake in this devotion to Our Lady Fatima, there will be a Mass at 8:00 a.m. every 1st Saturday of the month for the next 5 months. (starting March 2<sup>nd</sup>) Father Tony will be available for confessions before Mass at 7:30 a.m., as well as the normal confession times, 30 minutes prior to any weekend Mass.





### **2024 Lenten Regulations:**

<u>Abstinence:</u> Those 14 years and over are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

**Fasting:** Everyone ages 18 - 59, are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is generally understood to mean eating only one full meal each day. Two other partial meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken; but together they should not equal another full meal. (Other recommended forms of fasting, could include limiting alcoholic drink, needless television, video games, internet use, and social entertainment.)

<u>Almsgiving</u> is the act of giving to the poor. Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church.


**Prayer** is in order to deepen one's love for Christ, all are urged to attending daily Mass and frequenting the Sacrament of Penance / Reconciliation.

#### Did you know about the number "40"???

- · Lent consists of the 40 days preceding Easter.
- · 40 days of rain, at the time of the Great Flood
- · Noah sending forth the raven after 40 days
- · 40 days was the time required for embalming
- Moses spent three consecutive periods of "forty days and forty nights" on Mount Sinai: 40 days of fasting by Moses
- Goliath challenged the Israelites for forty days before David defeated him
- The prophet Elijah had to walk 40 days and 40 nights before arriving to mount Horeb
- · Spies were sent by Moses to explore the land of Canaan (promised to the children of Israel) for "forty days"
- · Nineveh would be overthrown after 40 days
- · 40 is the symbolism of the siege and exiles
- · Israelites wandering in the wilderness for 40 years
- · 40 years of peace in Israel
- · 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted by the devil.
- Christ appears for 40 days after the Resurrection -40 days was the period from the Resurrection of Jesus to the Ascension of Jesus.

During this Lenten season, create a clean heart in me, God. Dust off the unmindful activity that constantly collects there. De-clutter my heart from harsh judgments and negativity. 


<u>Homebound:</u> If you would like to minister to the homebound by visiting them and bringing them Communion, please contact S. Karen 507-514-3226.




Our political discourse has become increasingly rancorous and bitter. The U.S. bishops began a campaign leading into the 2020 election to restore civility to our public and political discourse

# **Preparing for a Great Marriage:**

The Catholic Church teaches that marriage is a covenant, a contract and a bond between a man and a woman that forms a partnership for life. The marriage bond is a unique and exclusive relationship between husband and wife for the sanctification of the couple and for the procreation and Christ-centered nurturing of children in a family.

The family, with its foundation in marriage, is a fundamental unit of the Church. Marriage is also a basic social institution of human society. Marital love is at the service of the couple, the children, the community, and of the world. Because of its timeless importance, the Church teachers that marriage between two baptized Christians is a sacrament, a source of grace and a sign of God's love for the world.

Every sacrament needs preparation for its fruitful celebration. The Church wants to ensure that those entering the life-long commitment of marriage are adequately prepared for the riches and the responsibilities that are intrinsic to it. This is why the Diocese of Jefferson City has a policy for marriage preparation. It is not to make the couple "check the boxes" or "jump through hoops." In her efforts of remote, proximate and immediate preparation, the Church is not trying to make it more difficult to get married, but rather provide the best opportunity for equipping the couple to live a shared life of love, compassion and nurturing grace.
