

#### From the Gospel Reading of John 12:20-33:

Some Greeks who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus."

#### Reflection:

Jesus and his disciples hadn't preached to these Greeks. They didn't proselytize them; they came of their own free will. What was the attraction? They and we are attracted by the One who, in His hour, is a completely faithful servant to God, who shows total generosity, willing to give up everything for us, without holding back anything in reserve.

- How have we benefited from the sacrifices others have made on our behalf?
- What sacrifices are we being asked to make for the wellbeing of others?
- How have we experienced the fruits of these sacrifices in our own lives?



next three Mondays to practice for



Holy Saturday (the Easter Vigil) begins at 8:00 p.m. The vigil is a remembrance how dark the world is without Jesus, Christ's burial in the tomb. We prepare, reflect, and anticipate the resurrection of Christ.

#### **2024 Lenten Regulations:**

<u>Abstinence:</u> Those 14 years and over are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

**Fasting:** Everyone ages 18 - 59, are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is generally understood to mean eating only one full meal each day. Two other partial meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken; but together they should not equal another full meal. (Other recommended forms of fasting, could include limiting alcoholic drink, needless television, video games, internet use, and social entertainment.)

<u>Almsgiving</u> is the act of giving to the poor. Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church.


<u>Prayer</u> is in order to deepen one's love for Christ, all are urged to attending daily Mass and frequenting the Sacrament of Penance / Reconciliation.

One of our parishioners created a Stations of the Cross using Holy Cross Church! It is creatively made and is wonderful to use when praying the Stations at home.



#### Did you know about the number "40"???


- · Lent consists of the 40 days preceding Easter.
- · 40 days of rain, at the time of the Great Flood
- · Noah sending forth the raven after 40 days
- · 40 days was the time required for embalming
- Moses spent three consecutive periods of "forty days and forty nights" on Mount Sinai: 40 days of fasting by Moses
- Goliath challenged the Israelites for forty days before David defeated him
- The prophet Elijah had to walk 40 days and 40 nights before arriving to mount Horeb
- Spies were sent by Moses to explore the land of Canaan (promised to the children of Israel) for "forty days"
- · Nineveh would be overthrown after 40 days
- · 40 is the symbolism of the siege and exiles
- · Israelites wandering in the wilderness for 40 years
- · 40 years of peace in Israel
- · 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted by the devil.
- · Christ appears for 40 days after the Resurrection -40 days was the period from the Resurrection of Jesus to the Ascension of Jesus.

The Dioceses is excited to introduce a Diocesan Youth Council which was established by Bishop McKnight on Friday, February 16, 2024.

The vision for the Diocesan Youth Council is based off Christus Vivit, allowing for a place for young voices to be heard while also equipping the young people to be disciples in our Church.

#### **Qualifications to Serve on the Council**

A person must meet the following requirements:

- Be a Catholic in full communion with the Catholic Church
- Received all the sacraments of initiation and be an active steward of the parish
- Must be outstanding in firm faith, good morals, and prudence
- High school student at the time of their application and can commit to at least 1 term (2 years)
- (preferred) Active or previous leadership experience in their parish and/or institution

#### **Expectations of Members**

A member of the council is required to commit to the following:

- Attend quarterly meetings in person at the chancery building in Jefferson City. Meetings are always on Saturdays.
  - o The first Diocesan Youth Council meeting will be May 11 from 9am-2:30pm. This will include a morning of recollection.
- Attend a yearly leadership retreat with the Diocesan Youth Council.
- Participate in leadership opportunities at a minimum of one diocesan youth gathering (i.e. diocesan youth rally, NCYC, summer camps, Totus Tuus, Confirmation Retreat).

Deadline for Application is April 5 and will be announced by April 19, 2024.






#### **Cemetery/ Columbarium:**



disclosing abuse for the first time must be compassionate. 
Our political discourse has become increasingly rancorous and bitter. The U.S. bishops began a campaign leading into the 2020 election to restore civility to our public and political discourse

**R.** Do not despise our pleas and deliver us from every danger, O glorious and blessed Virgin. Amen.







### **Preparing for a Great Marriage:**

The Catholic Church teaches that marriage is a covenant, a contract and a bond between a man and a woman that forms a partnership for life. The marriage bond is a unique and exclusive relationship between husband and wife for the sanctification of the couple and for the procreation and Christ-centered nurturing of children in a family.

The family, with its foundation in marriage, is a fundamental unit of the Church. Marriage is also a basic social institution of human society. Marital love is at the service of the couple, the children, the community, and of the world. Because of its timeless importance, the Church teachers that marriage between two baptized Christians is a sacrament, a source of grace and a sign of God's love for the world.

Every sacrament needs preparation for its fruitful celebration. The Church wants to ensure that those entering the life-long commitment of marriage are adequately prepared for the riches and the responsibilities that are intrinsic to it. This is why the Diocese of Jefferson City has a policy for marriage preparation. It is not to make the couple "check the boxes" or "jump through hoops." In her efforts of remote, proximate and immediate preparation, the Church is not trying to make it more difficult to get married, but rather provide the best opportunity for equipping the couple to live a shared life of love, compassion and nurturing grace.
