

Groundhog Day:



Punxsutawney Phil, will once again appear at sunrise on February 2 at Gobbler's Knob in Pennsylvania to make his annual prediction. Will he see his shadow? Will we have 6 more weeks of winter?

Do you know the story of Groundhog Day? The story actually begins with Candlemas Day! Early Christians declared if there are clear skies on Candlemas Day, this meant a longer winter. Germanic tribes declared that if the sun made an appearance on Candlemas Day a hedgehog would cast a shadow, thus predicting six more weeks of bad weather or "Second Winter." German settlers brought the tradition to Pennsylvania, swapping hedgehogs for groundhogs to forecast the weather. In 1886, the Punxsutawney Groundhog Club was formed, and a local editor declared Punxsutawney Phil as the official weather prognosticator.

"Who is this king of glory? It is the Lord."


Reflection:

Many people feel it can be a great help to their grieving family

members if the desires of the deceased were planned by him/herself before the time of death. Whether cremation or burial is chosen, consider Holy Cross as yours or your loved one's final resting place. Many people are not aware that the proper practice for cremation is to place the cremains in the columbarium or



bury them in the cemetery. If members of our community have the cremains of a loved one in their home, or another place other than the cemetery, they should make arrangements to give their loved ones a place to rest in the columbarium or cemetery with the proper prayers of internment.

Breaking the Silence of Abuse:

acknowledge their pain and how difficult it is to talk about it. False allegations are very rare. Our initial response to someone who is

disclosing abuse for the first time must be compassionate. For those who need to report abuse, encourage them to contact our Victims Assistance Coordinator, Jacqueline Baldwin, (573-694-3199) and to make use of the appropriate State of Missouri hotline (1-800-392-3738) or the Attorney General's clergy abuse online form. Civilize it!


Our political discourse has become increasingly rancorous and bitter. The U.S. bishops began a campaign leading into the 2020 election to restore civility to our public and political discourse
