Blessed Palms - Collected:

A basket is placed in the back of church all through Lent to collect blessed palms for burning. Blessed palms can also be burned or buried at home. Please do not dispose of them in the trash since they are a sacramental.

First Reconciliation:



On Saturday, March 15th at 10 a.m., the children preparing for the Sacrament of First Holy Communion will make their First Reconciliation. Pray for the children, their parents catechist, Maureen Sarles. First Holy Communion is scheduled for May 11th, Good Shepherd Sunday!

Sacramental Items should be treated with special reverence. The 'rule of thumb' is that anything that has been blessed should be buried or burned and the ashes buried. This type of disposal honors their sacred purpose and returns them to the earth in a dignified manner. It also provides a wonderful opportunity to offer a simple prayer of thanksgiving and ask God's blessing upon your family, home, garden, business, etc.

From the Gospel Reading - Luke 6: 17, 20-26:

Jesus said, "Blessed are you who are poor, For the kingdom of God is yours."

Reflection:

As Jesus announced, the blessings of the kingdom are already present to his disciples – but not fully. Thus, his Beatitudes stir up hope and form our way of thinking and acting as we wait for the fullness of God's Reign. We persevere in our struggles to live as members of God's community and we pay special attention to those in need, those Jesus has called "blessed."

So, we ask ourselves:

- What norms do I use to measure "success" in life?
- How would those norms measure up to the Beatitudes?
- Or, are they among the "woes" Jesus rejects?



Diocesan 2024 Special Collections

With the new stewardship model, the parishes within the Diocese of Jefferson City, tithe 10% monthly to the Diocese. Before this new Stewardship model there were multiple Diocesan collections. Now there are only 3 special collections! But, you may ask yourself, what does the Diocese do with this money? Here is the answer:

The Diocese shared nearly \$1 million with beneficiaries! **DIOCESE OF**

In March, \$330,998.54 was given toward the Easter Special Collection. These lefferson City gifts support retired priests and religious. Following

that collection, the diocese distributed \$165,449.27 to the National Religious Retirement Office, and \$165,449.27 was transferred to the Priest Mutual Benefit Society. The diocese held a Missions Special Collection during July 20-21. This collection raised \$194,805 in support of the Diocesan mission's work. These funds provide assistance to the people in the home dioceses of the mission priests serving us, as well as support national collections that benefit missions work around the world. The 2024 Christmas parish assessment, supported by gifts given during the Christmas Special Collection, raised \$447,408. From that total, \$200,000 was given to the Infirm Priest Fund, and \$247,408 was distributed to the Seminarian Studies Fund. The Dioceses extends their appreciation to all the faithful for their extraordinary support of these important needs in our diocese. In 2025, the Diocese of Jefferson City will repeat this same schedule, with special collections held at Easter, in July, and at Christmas.

Cemetery/ Columbarium:

Many people feel it can be a great help to their grieving family members if the desires of the deceased were planned by him/herself before the time of death. Whether cremation or burial is chosen, consider Holy Cross as yours or your loved one's final resting place. Many people are not aware that the proper practice for cremation is to place the cremains in the columbarium or bury them in the cemetery. If members of our community have the cremains of a loved one in their home, or another place other than the cemetery, they should make arrangements to give their loved ones a place to rest in the columbarium or cemetery with the proper prayers of internment.



Civilize it!


Our political discourse has become increasingly rancorous and bitter. The U.S. bishops began a campaign leading into the 2020 election to restore civility to our public and political discourse



Jefferson City Diocesan Women's Ministry:

The Women's Ministry of Jefferson City was established to help the women of our diocese connect with each other so that we can support each other in our spiritual journeys. Preparing for a Great Marriage:

The Catholic Church teaches that marriage is a covenant, a contract and a bond between a man and a woman that forms a partnership for life. The marriage bond is a unique and exclusive relationship between husband and wife for the sanctification of the couple and for the procreation and Christ-centered nurturing of children in a family.

The family, with its foundation in marriage, is a fundamental unit of the Church. Marriage is also a basic social institution of human society. Marital love is at the service of the couple, the children, the community, and of the world. Because of its timeless importance, the Church teachers that marriage between two baptized Christians is a sacrament, a source of grace and a sign of God's love for the world.

Every sacrament needs preparation for its fruitful celebration. The Church wants to ensure that those entering the life-long commitment of marriage are adequately prepared for the riches and the responsibilities that are intrinsic to it. This is why the Diocese of Jefferson City has a policy for marriage preparation. It is not to make the couple "check the boxes" or "jump through hoops." In her efforts of remote, proximate and immediate preparation, the Church is not trying to make it more difficult to get married, but rather provide the best opportunity for equipping the couple to live a shared life of love, compassion and nurturing grace.
