

From the Gospel Reading - Matthew 17: 1-9:


“As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, “Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.”


So, we ask ourselves:

2026 Lenten Regulations:

Abstinence: Those 14 years and over are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

Fasting: Everyone ages 18 - 59, are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is generally understood to mean eating only one full meal each day. Two other partial meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken; but together they should not equal another full meal. (Other recommended forms of fasting, could include limiting alcoholic drink, needless television, video games, internet use, and social entertainment.)

Almsgiving is the act of giving to the poor. Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church.


Prayer is in order to deepen one's love for Christ, all are urged to attending daily Mass and frequenting the Sacrament of Penance / Reconciliation.

Did you know about the number "40"???

- Lent consists of the 40 days preceding Easter.
- 40 days of rain, at the time of the Great Flood
- Noah sending forth the raven after 40 days
- 40 days was the time required for embalming
- Moses spent three consecutive periods of "forty days and forty nights" on Mount Sinai: 40 days of fasting by Moses
- Goliath challenged the Israelites for forty days before David defeated him
- The prophet Elijah had to walk 40 days and 40 nights before arriving to mount Horeb
- Spies were sent by Moses to explore the land of Canaan (promised to the children of Israel) for "forty days"
- Nineveh would be overthrown after 40 days
- 40 is the symbolism of the siege and exiles
- Israelites wandering in the wilderness for 40 years
- 40 years of peace in Israel
- 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted by the devil.
- Christ appears for 40 days after the Resurrection -40 days was the period from the Resurrection of Jesus to the Ascension of Jesus.



Lenten Small Faith-Sharing Groups:

This Lent, parishioners from all three parishes are encouraged to join (or lead) a *Small Faith-Sharing Group*. The parish will provide all needed Leader and Study Guides. Groups will meet **4–5 times** and watch/discuss short episodes from *Forgiven: The Transforming Power of Confession* on FORMED. A series focusing on: exploring the Sacrament of Reconciliation, focusing on God's mercy, and the healing power of confession.







Cemetery/ Columbarium:

Many people feel it can be a great help to their grieving family members if the desires of the deceased were planned by him/herself before the time of death. Whether cremation or burial is chosen, consider Holy Cross as yours or your loved one's final resting place. Many people are not aware that the proper practice for cremation is to place the cremains in the columbarium or bury them in the cemetery. If members of our community have the cremains of a loved one in their home, or another place other than the cemetery, they should make arrangements to give their loved ones a place to rest in the columbarium or cemetery with the proper prayers of interment.





Preparing for a Great Marriage:

The Catholic Church teaches that marriage is a covenant, a contract and a bond between a man and a woman that forms a partnership for life. The marriage bond is a unique and exclusive relationship between husband and wife for the sanctification of the couple and for the procreation and Christ-centered nurturing of children in a family.

The family, with its foundation in marriage, is a fundamental unit of the Church. Marriage is also a basic social institution of human society. Marital love is at the service of the couple, the children, the community, and of the world.

Because of its timeless importance, the Church teaches that marriage between two baptized Christians is a sacrament, a source of grace and a sign of God's love for the world.

Every sacrament needs preparation for its fruitful celebration. The Church wants to ensure that those entering the life-long commitment of marriage are adequately prepared for the riches and the responsibilities that are intrinsic to it. This is why the Diocese of Jefferson City has a policy for marriage preparation. It is not to make the couple "check the boxes" or "jump through hoops." In her efforts of remote, proximate and immediate preparation, the Church is not trying to make it more difficult to get married, but rather provide the best opportunity for equipping the couple to live a shared life of love, compassion and nurturing grace.
