

Pentecost Next Week – June 8th:

Pentecost is a moveable feast, meaning its date varies each year depending on the date of Easter. It typically falls on the seventh Sunday after Easter (50 days after Easter). The word "Pentecost" is derived from a Greek word meaning "50 days.

Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples in Jerusalem, as they were celebrating the Feast of Weeks/Spring Harvest (Shavuot).

"A great wind blew and flames appeared as tongues of fire", symbolizing the presence of the Holy Spirit. Despite language barriers, the disciples were able to communicate effectively during their sermons, a miraculous sign of the Spirit's power. As Catholics, we recognize Pentecost as the moment when the Church was born.

In honor of this occasion, we invite you to wear red to Mass as a symbol of the Holy Spirit's presence and our unity in Christ. Let us come together in prayer, inviting the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts and guide us in our faith journey.



Parish Hall and Faith Formation Considerations:

With the closing of Holy Cross School, the teachers are packing up their classrooms for the final time. Items personally purchased by teachers over the years will be taken with them, while parish-owned items will remain.



Additionally, many pieces of technology and equipment were purchased through EANS funding (Emergency



Non-Public Assistance to Schools), a government program created to support non-public schools during emergencies such as COVID-19. These EANSfunded items-including much

of the school's updated technology—are considered government property and must be returned or made available to other non-public schools. This includes the Smart Boards in each classroom, which were also utilized by the Faith Formation program to help catechists teach the faith more effectively. Once these are removed, the parish will need to consider how to replace this technology and other materials that will no longer be available.

As the parish looks ahead, discussions are taking place about how best to use existing resources to support and grow the faith life of the community. Some possibilities being considered are: hiring a Parish Administrator, a DRE Director of Religious Education. Another consideration was a Youth Leader, who would focus more on outreach for young people. In addition, there is discussion about the need for a Custodian, Building Coordinator, or Maintenance Person to ensure the parish hall remains clean, cared for and maintaining all the furnaces, boilers, and AC units.

No final decisions have been made—these are all ideas in active discussion. Parishioners are encouraged to share their thoughts, suggestions, and prayers as Holy Cross begins this new chapter, committed to nourishing the faith life of the entire community.

Transition in Diocesan Leadership:

This past Tuesday, May 27, the Most Reverend Shawn



McKnight was installed as the Archbishop of Kansas City in With Kansas. his appointment, the Diocese of Jefferson City is now a vacant see—meaning we temporarily without a bishop. The College of Consultors for the Diocese of Jefferson City will soon meet to elect a diocesan administrator. This administrator will govern the diocese until the Holy Father,

Pope Leo XIV, appoints a new bishop. During this time, all diocesan policies remain in effect, and no major changes may be made. There is no set timeline for when a new bishop will be appointed, though such transitions can often take several months. Please continue to pray for our diocesan leaders during this time of transition.

disclosing abuse for the first time must be compassionate. For those who need to report abuse, encourage them to contact our Victims Assistance Coordinator, Jacqueline Baldwin, (573-694-3199) and to make use of the appropriate State of Missouri hotline (1-800-392-3738) or the Attorney General's clergy abuse online form. 

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.


I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified,

Preparing for a Great Marriage:

The Catholic Church teaches that marriage is a covenant, a contract and a bond between a man and a woman that forms a partnership for life. The marriage bond is a unique and exclusive relationship between husband and wife for the sanctification of the couple and for the procreation and Christ-centered nurturing of children in a family.

The family, with its foundation in marriage, is a fundamental unit of the Church. Marriage is also a basic social institution of human society. Marital love is at the service of the couple, the children, the community, and of the world. Because of its timeless importance, the Church teachers that marriage between two baptized Christians is a sacrament, a source of grace and a sign of God's love for the world.

Every sacrament needs preparation for its fruitful celebration. The Church wants to ensure that those entering the life-long commitment of marriage are adequately prepared for the riches and the responsibilities that are intrinsic to it. This is why the Diocese of Jefferson City has a policy for marriage preparation. It is not to make the couple "check the boxes" or "jump through hoops." In her efforts of remote, proximate and immediate preparation, the Church is not trying to make it more difficult to get married, but rather provide the best opportunity for equipping the couple to live a shared life of love, compassion and nurturing grace.
