


Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children:

We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the



Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard. January 23rd is designated as a day of prayer and penance in all the Dioceses of the United States of America. We are called to observe this day through prayer, fasting and/or giving alms.

Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ marks the end of the Christmas season. Next week we will begin Ordinary Time



in the Church's liturgical year. Jesus being baptized identifies Him with sinful humanity. Since he is God, the Son, he is without original sin and no personal sin. Our baptism is to cleanse us of both original and personal sins and to make us children of God. Jesus made a personal commitment to his heavenly Father to save

humanity from sin and to reconcile us with him. Through our baptism into Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, we are called to make individual personal commitments to Jesus to continue his mission on earth. We are to show respect, love, and mercy to those who society may not care for.

The Epiphany of Our Lord:

The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek verb "epiphainen", which means "to manifest," or "to make known." The feast of the Epiphany celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world.

Three of those events are:

- · The visit of the Magi (or the 3 Kings).
- · The Baptism of Jesus on January 9th
- The miracle at the wedding feast in Cana Jesus' 1st miracle. Home blessing, there is a tradition of "chalking the doors" by writing a formula on top of a doorway to your home. The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar the 3 Magi who came to visit Jesus. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase of, "Christus mansionem benedicat" "May Christ bless the house." The "+" represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "25" at the end, marks the year. May Christ bless our homes; may He stay with us and dwell within throughout the year. 20+C+M+B+25.



Cemetery/ Columbarium:

Many people feel it can be a great help to their grieving family members if the desires of the deceased were planned by him/herself before the time of death. Whether cremation or burial is chosen, consider Holy Cross as yours or your loved one's final resting place. Many people are not aware that the proper practice for cremation is to place the cremains in the columbarium or bury them in the cemetery. If members of our community have the cremains of a loved one in their home, or another place other than the cemetery, they should make arrangements to give their loved ones a place to rest in the columbarium or cemetery with the proper prayers of internment.

Breaking the Silence of Abuse:

As a diocese, we are committed to breaking the silence of abuse. When someone is reporting abuse, we must



acknowledge their pain and how difficult it is to talk about it. False allegations are very rare. Our initial response to someone who is

disclosing abuse for the first time must be compassionate. For those who need to report abuse, encourage them to contact our Victims Assistance Coordinator, Jacqueline Baldwin, (573-694-3199) and to make use of the appropriate State of Missouri hotline (1-800-392-3738) or the Attorney General's clergy abuse online form. 
Our political discourse has become increasingly rancorous and bitter. The U.S. bishops began a campaign leading into the 2020 election to restore civility to our public and political discourse



Preparing for a Great Marriage:

The Catholic Church teaches that marriage is a covenant, a contract and a bond between a man and a woman that forms a partnership for life. The marriage bond is a unique and exclusive relationship between husband and wife for the sanctification of the couple and for the procreation and Christ-centered nurturing of children in a family.

The family, with its foundation in marriage, is a fundamental unit of the Church. Marriage is also a basic social institution of human society. Marital love is at the service of the couple, the children, the community, and of the world. Because of its timeless importance, the Church teachers that marriage between two baptized Christians is a sacrament, a source of grace and a sign of God's love for the world.

Every sacrament needs preparation for its fruitful celebration. The Church wants to ensure that those entering the life-long commitment of marriage are adequately prepared for the riches and the responsibilities that are intrinsic to it. This is why the Diocese of Jefferson City has a policy for marriage preparation. It is not to make the couple "check the boxes" or "jump through hoops." In her efforts of remote, proximate and immediate preparation, the Church is not trying to make it more difficult to get married, but rather provide the best opportunity for equipping the couple to live a shared life of love, compassion and nurturing grace.
