

EASTER FACTS 🖉 YOU MAY NOT HAVE 🕯 **KNOWN!**

On Easter Sunday we celebrate the Resurrection. After we experienced the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday), we now sing "Alleluia" because Christ has risen from the dead. **BUT DID YOU KNOW?**

- Easter is an entire season!
- The liturgical season of Easter lasts for 50 days!
- Each year, Easter falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon or after the spring equinox.
- It is the second-longest season on the Church calendar.
- Eastertide is the period of fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday, May 19st this year.
- Divine Mercy Sunday is always the next Sunday after Easter. This year it is April 7th.
- The Easter candle is lit from the new flame and given new numbers for the year on Holy Saturday.
- The Easter candle is kept lit during the Easter Season to remind us that Jesus is present, and then after the Easter Season it is lit for baptisms and funerals.



Wishing you Christ's many blessings throughout this Easter season. May the Lord lift up your heart, this Easter and always, with the miracle of the season, may you have perfect peace and always feel His love shining in your life.



The vision for the Diocesan Youth Council is based off Christus Vivit, allowing for a place for young voices to be heard while also equipping the young people to be disciples in our Church.

Qualifications to Serve on the Council

A person must meet the following requirements:

- Be a Catholic in full communion with the Catholic Church
- Received all the sacraments of initiation and be an active steward of the parish
- Must be outstanding in firm faith, good morals, and prudence
- High school student at the time of their application and can commit to at least 1 term (2 years)
- (preferred) Active or previous leadership experience in their parish and/or institution

Expectations of Members


A member of the council is required to commit to the following:

- Attend quarterly meetings in person at the chancery building in Jefferson City. Meetings are always on Saturdays.
 - The first Diocesan Youth Council meeting will be May 11 from 9am-2:30pm. This will include a morning of recollection.
- Attend a yearly leadership retreat with the Diocesan Youth Council.
- Participate in leadership opportunities at a minimum of one diocesan youth gathering (i.e. diocesan youth rally, NCYC, summer camps, Totus Tuus, Confirmation Retreat).

Deadline for Application is April 5 and will be announced by April 19, 2024.

Dr. Mary Amore, Executive Director holds a Doctor of Ministry Degree in Liturgy and Master of Arts in Pastoral Studies from Catholic Theological Union. Dr. Amore is the author of three books: *Primary Symbols of Worship and the Call to Participation, Every day with Mary*, and *Every Day with Joseph*, as well as the creator of two DVD Series: *Eucharist: Pathway of Transformation, Healing and Discipleship*, and *From Mary's Heart to Yours*, published by Pauline Media.

Due to hospitals' strict protocols, it is important to seek the sacraments of the Anointing of the Sick and Reconciliation prior to going to the hospital. Most hospitals only allow a priest to provide the sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick if the patient has been placed on comfort care (hospice) or is nearing death. Please pray for the many who are ill or are home bound.


Homebound: If you would like to minister to the homebound by visiting them and bringing them Communion, please contact S. Karen 507-514-3226.

Cemetery/ Columbarium:

Many people feel it can be a great help to their grieving family

members if the desires of the deceased were planned by him/herself before the time of death. Whether cremation or burial is chosen, consider Holy Cross as vours or your loved one's final resting place. Many people are not aware that the proper practice for cremation is to place the cremains in the columbarium or



bury them in the cemetery. If members of our community have the cremains of a loved one in their home, or another place other than the cemetery, they should make arrangements to give their loved ones a place to rest in the columbarium or cemetery with the proper prayers of internment.


Our political discourse has become increasingly rancorous and bitter. The U.S. bishops began a campaign leading into the 2020 election to restore civility to our public and political discourse

Preparing for a Great Marriage:

The Catholic Church teaches that marriage is a covenant, a contract and a bond between a man and a woman that forms a partnership for life. The marriage bond is a unique and exclusive relationship between husband and wife for the sanctification of the couple and for the procreation and Christ-centered nurturing of children in a family.

The family, with its foundation in marriage, is a fundamental unit of the Church. Marriage is also a basic social institution of human society. Marital love is at the service of the couple, the children, the community, and of the world. Because of its timeless importance, the Church teachers that marriage between two baptized Christians is a sacrament, a source of grace and a sign of God's love for the world.

Every sacrament needs preparation for its fruitful celebration. The Church wants to ensure that those entering the life-long commitment of marriage are adequately prepared for the riches and the responsibilities that are intrinsic to it. This is why the Diocese of Jefferson City has a policy for marriage preparation. It is not to make the couple "check the boxes" or "jump through hoops." In her efforts of remote, proximate and immediate preparation, the Church is not trying to make it more difficult to get married, but rather provide the best opportunity for equipping the couple to live a shared life of love, compassion and nurturing grace.
