


### **Baby Bottle Boomerangs:**



### **Holy Martyrs Church of Japan:**



#### The Ascension of the Lord (June 1<sup>st</sup>):

Next week is the Ascension of Our Lord. This day celebrates the day that Christ, in the presence of His apostles, ascended bodily into Heaven.

Jesus and His disciples went to Mount Olives, near Jerusalem. There, Jesus promised His followers that they would soon receive the Holy Spirit, and He instructed them to remain in Jerusalem until the Spirit had come. (This happens on Pentecost)

As Jesus gave them His blessing, He began to ascend into heaven. It is plain from scripture



that Jesus' Ascension was a literal, bodily return to heaven. He rose from the ground gradually and visibly, observed by many intent onlookers. As the disciples strained to catch a last glimpse of Jesus, a cloud hid Him from their view, and two angels appeared and promised Christ's return "in just the same way that you have watched Him go".

#### Parish Hall and Faith Formation Considerations:

With the closing of Holy Cross School, the teachers are packing up their classrooms for the final time. Items personally purchased by teachers over the years will be taken with them, while parish-owned items will remain.



Additionally, many pieces of technology and equipment were purchased through EANS funding (Emergency Assistance to Non-Public Schools), a government program created to support non-public schools during emergencies such as COVID-19. These EANS-funded items including much of the school's updated technology—are considered government property and must be returned or made available to other non-public schools. This includes



the Smart Boards in each classroom, which were also utilized by the Faith Formation program to help catechists teach the faith more effectively. Once these are removed, the parish will

need to consider how to replace this technology and other materials that will no longer be available.

As the parish looks ahead, discussions are taking place about how best to use existing resources to support and grow the faith life of the community. One possibility being considered is hiring a **DRE** (**Director of Religious Education**). Another consideration could be a **Youth Leader**, who would focus more on outreach for young people. In addition, there is discussion about the need for a **custodian or building coordinator** to ensure the parish hall remains clean and ready for all events and gatherings. No final decisions have been made—these are all ideas in active discussion. Parishioners are encouraged to share their thoughts, suggestions, and prayers as Holy Cross begins this new chapter, committed to nourishing the faith life of the entire community.

Homebound: If you would like to minister to the homebound by visiting them and bringing them Communion, please contact S. Karen 507-514-3226.


### **Yoga Class on Tuesdays Offered at Holy Cross:**

bury them in the cemetery. If members of our community have the cremains of a loved one in their home, or another place other than the cemetery, they should make arrangements to give their loved ones a place to rest in the columbarium or cemetery with the proper prayers of internment.

If you are planning a Baptism, there is a preparation





## **Breaking the Silence of Abuse:**

acknowledge their pain and how difficult it is to talk about it. False allegations are very rare. Our initial response to someone who is

disclosing abuse for the first time must be compassionate. For those who need to report abuse, encourage them to contact our Victims Assistance Coordinator, Jacqueline Baldwin, (573-694-3199) and to make use of the appropriate State of Missouri hotline (1-800-392-3738) or the Attorney General's clergy abuse online form. All of this information is also on our website, under the 'report abuse' tab. 
#### **Propane Offer:**

## **Preparing for a Great Marriage:**

The Catholic Church teaches that marriage is a covenant, a contract and a bond between a man and a woman that forms a partnership for life. The marriage bond is a unique and exclusive relationship between husband and wife for the sanctification of the couple and for the procreation and Christ-centered nurturing of children in a family.

The family, with its foundation in marriage, is a fundamental unit of the Church. Marriage is also a basic social institution of human society. Marital love is at the service of the couple, the children, the community, and of the world. Because of its timeless importance, the Church teachers that marriage between two baptized Christians is a sacrament, a source of grace and a sign of God's love for the world.

Every sacrament needs preparation for its fruitful celebration. The Church wants to ensure that those entering the life-long commitment of marriage are adequately prepared for the riches and the responsibilities that are intrinsic to it. This is why the Diocese of Jefferson City has a policy for marriage preparation. It is not to make the couple "check the boxes" or "jump through hoops." In her efforts of remote, proximate and immediate preparation, the Church is not trying to make it more difficult to get married, but rather provide the best opportunity for equipping the couple to live a shared life of love, compassion and nurturing grace.
